Glossary of Terms

NLS: National Library Service, a free national library program providing braille and recorded materials to persons who cannot see regular print or handle print materials.

Member: A person who qualifies to receive free services from Christian Record Services.

USB: Universal Serial Bus, a system for connecting a computer to another device (such as a printer, keyboard, or mouse) by using a special kind of cord.

Quarterly: Produced once every quarter of a year.

BRF: Braille Ready File, often referred to as eBraille or web-braille, is a specialized digital text format used to create embossed braille or be read using a braille display or with a refreshable braille device.

MP3: An audio file format for storing, distributing, and streaming digital data.

All persons who are legally blind or physically unable to hold or focus on ink print are eligible for these free services. Individuals who receive state services for the blind qualify for services from Christian Record Services. Outside the United States, the availability of services may vary by region due to contractual agreements.

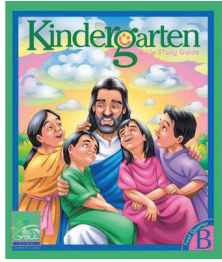

Resource selections may be made on the enclosed form; return the completed form in the postage-free envelope provided. Services should be requested in the name of the person who is to use them.

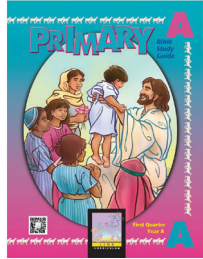

Audio Streaming Media



Kindergarten Bible Study Guide contains Bible stories and activities for during family worship. (Ages 3-4)



Primary Bible Study Guide contains Bible stories and activities for family worship time. (Ages 5-9)



Junior PowerPoints Bible Study Guide is based on Bible stories or other Scripture passages, and includes questions for discussion, helping the young learners draw lessons for application. (Ages 10-14)



Your Story Hour produces family-friendly radio dramas based on the Bible, historical heroes, and true-to-life adventures. These stories teach Biblical values, positive character traits, and principles for good decision-making. (All ages)



Discovery Mountain is a dramatized audio program where listeners experience adventure, mystery, campfire songs and, most importantly, get to know Jesus. (Ages 6-12)

Braille Magazine



The Children's Friend is filled with stories about outdoor adventures, missionary endeavors, children confronting peer pressure, and Bible stories. Issued quarterly in braille and BRF. (Ages 9-12)



The Naomi Chapman Turner Library for the Blind

About 2,000 audiobooks for all ages and reading levels are available to members who live in the United States.

Audiobooks are available on digital cartridges compatible with players distributed by the state services of the National Library Service (NLS) and digital download or streaming through Lib.Guide.

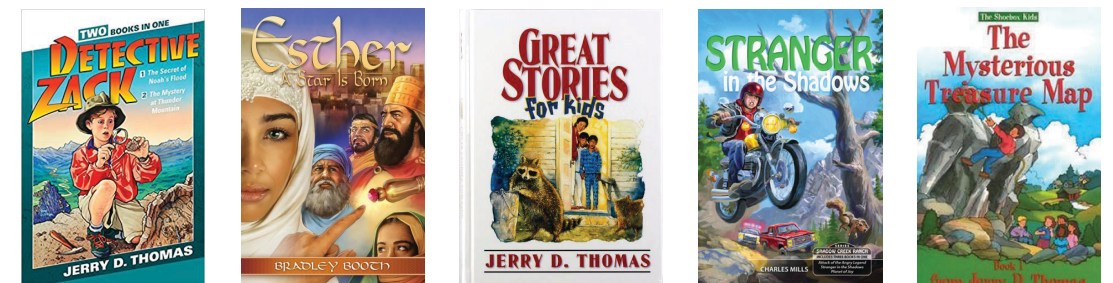
NOTE: Christian Record Services does not provide digital players. Digital players are available from the member's local NLS network library for the blind.

Audiobooks on digital cartridge may be checked out for 30 days, renewed upon request, and sent on a return/send basis. A member may check out up to three audiobooks at a time.

Letters or emails are sent to remind members to return overdue books.

All digital cartridge audiobooks are sent in postage-free, remailable containers. To return the books to the library, remove the address card from its holder on the mailer, turn it over, replace it in the holder, and mail the container. Check the mailer for proper contents before returning.

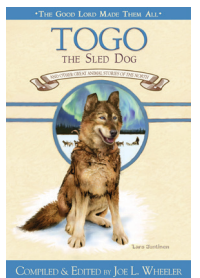

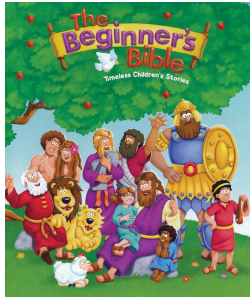
